First Lt. Alan A. Cozzalio, 22, was cited in Vietnam for action last Sept. 15 on a reconnaissance mission near Ben Tre.


Cozzalio, son of Mel J. Cozzalio of 5000 Marconi Ave., was piloting a helicopter in support of ground forces.


