

Ex-Durham Man Killed In Viet Nam

DURHAM (AP) — Second Lt. William Bayles Cawthorne, 24, formerly of Durham and Marietta, Ga., was identified Tuesday as one of five men killed in Viet Nam helicopter losses. Army sources stated that the aircraft piloted by Cawthorne was hit by small arms ground fire and crashed Tuesday.

Cawthorne and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Vester Cawthorne, lived on Guess Road until the family moved to California in 1951. In Durham Cawthorne attended Hillendale School and participated in midget football.

Cawthorne is survived by his parents and his wife Mrs. Earlene G. Cawthorne, formerly of California and now of Marietta, Ga. He was killed when communist guerrillas shot down his U.S. Army helicopter on a supply mission over the jungle mountains of central Viet Nam.

Military sources said that the helicopter was shot down about five miles east of Hiep Duc in Quang Tin Province. The aircraft crashed on the jungle-covered slope of a 1,000-foot high mountain in the highlands about 240 miles northeast of Saigon.

Also killed in the crash was PFC Freddy Dodson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Eugene V. Dodson of Marshall, Tex. Dodson was Cawthorne's crew chief.
