Dear Phoenix,

I wanted to send each and every one of you the enclosed information in case you can't attend the VHPA Reunion in Atlanta this year and want to attend the 47th Annual Reunion of the 101st Airborne Division Association in Colorado Springs, CO. Our reunion is in August, and we're celebrating several things; The 50th Anniversary of the formation of the division, the 25th Anniversary of the division's deployment to Vietnam, and the second anniversary of the division's deployment to the Persian Gulf.

We already have 172 registered for the reunion and have sold 93 t-shirts (see design). We have budgeted for 900, but believe attendance will exceed 1000 and maybe go as far as 1200. A good percentage of the people who attend are World War II types, but more and more Vietnam Vets are attending each year. This will be my fifth in a row. I've made alot of friends, and really enjoy spending time with everyone each year. The active division will be in attendance, the honor guard always performs and we've requested the jump team to perform 4-5 jumps for us in Colorado Springs. We negotiating with Ft. Carson to bring tanks, helicopters, etc. out to the hotel for display purposes, and an Special Forces "A" Team to perform repelling etc.

As you can see the tours we're offering will be great, there is hundreds of things to do in and around Colorado Springs. The reunion is being held at the Colorado Springs Sheraton Hotel, a beautiful facility, and the registration cost is \$65 person. This includes tickets to two evening dinners, the hospitality room, a specially minted coin to commemorate the reunion, and to cover entertainment and guest speaker expenses. Rooms at the Sheraton are \$62 plus tax. We're also planning some activities for children.

If you have additional questions, please let me know. We are not trying to compete with the VHPA's reunion in Atlanta, just offering an alternative this year during a different part of the summer. I would like to attend the reunion in Atlanta myself, but just don't have the time. Hope to hear from some of you soon!
