I would like to recommend that as soon as piasters are available, that another row of lights be installed in the Library Quonset. It is true that at this time the quonset is not being used much by students or faculty members. However, should there be more utilization of the quonset, it is essential that better light is made available. It is extremely difficult to find periodicals and documents in a semi-darkness.

I would also like to suggest that arrangements are being made for the air-conditioner to be kept on all day and all night. In addition to documents, the quonset contains all bound periodicals, which is the most expensive collection of the library (can be estimated at a cost of \$20.000). The humidity and heat are very damaging to books, and the air-conditioning at the quonset is extremely inadequate. Either more air-conditioners are needed or at least the air-conditioners should be on all the time.
