I have your memorandum of March 13 regarding the publication BULLETIN DES AMIS DU VIEUX HUE which you sent to Ruben Austin. May I urge you to tie this publication up for the M.S.U. Dear Mr. Barnes:

When Dr. Jason Finkle of the Michigan State University Group was in Hué recently, he conversed with you about a complete set of the Bulletin Des Amis du Vieux Hue which is for sale by a nearby monastery, as I understand it. I have now received word from the MSU campus that the University wants to purchase this set.

I wonder if you would be so kind as to pass on this information to the present owners of the set. If you would also inform me of the identity and address of the owners, we can take steps to arrange for details of the sale on behalf of the University.

I hesitate to ask more of you, but if it proves to be convenient, you might inquire as to 1) the price (50,000 piastres was the earlier estimate, I understand); and 2) the inclusion of the two separate indexes (1914-23 and 1914-41) in the set.

Dear Mr. Chapin:

Enclosed you will find a letter from Mr. Thomas J. Barnes, the American Vice Consul at Hué, giving information about publications in the hands of a monastery near Hué. Because Mr. Barnes' letter was somewhat ambiguous I made a point of inquiring further about the publications when I was in Hué earlier this week. I learned that the monastery is not interested in disposing of its one complete set of the BULLETIN DES AMIS DU VIEUX HUE but would be glad to sell extra copies (the word "sell" is not quite accurate, because the monastery prefers to think of receiving contributions, or donations of publications). I am sorry to have sent you incorrect information previously about the availability of a complete set of the BULLETIN, but Mr. Barnes apparently was under a misapprehension when he talked to Jason Finkle earlier.

I was uncertain as to whether the Library would be interested in a partial set of the BULLETIN and, therefore, made no commitment while in Hué. You will see from the enclosed sheet that entire years are missing, assuming that the complete set runs from 1914 to 1944. You will notice, too, that certain issues are missing for years listed. If you wish us to follow up on acquisitions of the incomplete set we shall see what we can do.

You will note from the enclosed letter from Brother Mora to Mr. Barnes that the monastery also has a partial collection of the REVUE INDOCHINOISE. In addition there are certain brochures which are listed on the same sheet as the BULLETIN and the REVUE. Some of these so-called brochures are apparently quite interesting, though I do not know how rare they are.

The monastery seems to have an oversimplified notion of the microfilming process. At any rate, I enclose also a list of the Imperial Annals which they have available for microfilming. It should be noted that there is already a project underway at Hué University to microfilm many of the documents of the Nguyen dynasty and that the project suggested by the monastery would involve considerable duplication of the University's effort.
