Meeting with the Rector and Chief Advisor on Friday,
September 11, 1959

1. Professor Hach has been appointed Dean of the Faculty of Law at Hue University.
2. Only one reply has been received by the Rector in response to the letters sent to the Colombo Plan people asking them to teach English at the NIA. LDM will contact those who have not answered and ascertain their answers. If, as is suspected, they answer in the negative, the plan is to contact the women who taught English during the intensive summer English language course.
M.S. will finish list.
3. Mock-up of the NIA. The Rector announced that a letter from the mock-up maker indicated a price of 85,000\$VN for the mock-up.
4. Seminar on in-service training. The Rector stated that he regretted the delay in receipt of invitations by Messrs. Smuckler and Musolf. He hoped that both would be able to attend the closing session.

5. Miss Kim-Sa. The Chief Advisor stated that Miss Kim-Sa understands her salary as acting librarian may be less than the salary she was earning before she left for the United States. LDM was requested to furnish salaries earned by other members of library staff to the Vice Rector.

6. Departure of Ie Ba Do. In response to the Rector's inquiry about the delay in Do's departure, Chief Advisor indicated that no visa number had yet been received. Everything else is ready; hopefully Do still can leave by the 15th of this month.
7. Lectures by MSU professors at the NIA. The Rector spoke of the desirability of a series of public lectures at the Institute. Messrs. Smuckler and Musolf will confer on lecture topics and lecturers and will submit proposals to the NIA.

8. Status of construction of the NIA campus. The Rector believes that the architect has finished drawing plans and that bids will go out shortly. Another meeting of the committee on constructing the new campus will be held next week. The Chief Advisor urged that the ground breaking ceremony be advanced if possible to the national day period at the beginning of November. This would necessitate choosing a contractor before that date.
9. Library's receipt of official GVN documents. The Chief Advisor inquired whether the library was now receiving official documents of GVN agencies automatically. The Rector indicated that he thought so. LDM was assigned to check on this matter with Miss Heyman before her departure.
