

Representatives of the Police and Security Services of Vietnam, the National Institute of Administration, and of USOM joined with employees of the Michigan State University Group in a memorial service on March 24 in commemoration of the death Thursday of Mr. Melvin E. Handville, an MSU police specialist. Brief tributes to Mr. Handville were given by Mr. Nguyen Van Hay, Chief of Cabinet of the VBI, representing General Nguyen Van La, Mr. Tran Van Tu, Director of the Municipal Police, and Mr. Ralph F. Turner, Chief of MSU's Police Administration Division. The service was held at the MSU headquarters at 137 Pasteur.

Mr. Handville, who was 50 years of age, served as a training advisor in Vietnam for more than three years. A member of the New York State Police from 1939 to 1957, he eventually became Executive Training Officer of the New York State Police Training School. He served in the United States Armed Forces during World War II, earning a Purple Heart. He is survived by a sister and one nephew.
