Proposed Research

I wish to propose that the research division undertake a study of the system of reporting economic information through governmental channels from the village up to the central government. The project would consist of collecting all report forms currently used in the various provinces for reporting such data, analysing these forms in terms of their usefulness, looking for breaks in the flow of data or places where consolidation and summarization are needed; and finally, proposing changes in the system.

This project could draw upon the services of the students who go to the provinces during the first half of the year. These students could collect the existing forms and learn how they work. Then when the students return to Saigon, they could break up into working groups to consider and suggest changes in the system of reporting different types of data. Various faculty members could direct the working groups. The proposed changes could be made in the name of the Institute. This project appeals to me as a highly useful Institute undertaking.

SUBJECT : Research Division Meeting

At the Research Division Meeting this morning several topics were discussed:

1. The Division requested that we submit lists of proposed research subjects for the 80 third-year students to work on during their six-months stay in the provinces. Such lists should be divided between administrative and economic subjects, and should be submitted at the Research Division meeting on December 7th. All faculty members are encouraged to cooperate.

2. None of the Research Division members were aware of the current study of provincial administration being made in My-Tho province by the Field Administration Division. From my limited knowledge of the project, I informed them of its general purposes, however, I thought it was the purpose of the much publicized integration to bring about such exchanges of information and cooperation.

*Public administration project proposals:*

1. Evaluation of in-service training programs as they take place.
2. Evaluation of NIA teaching programs, including interviewing students and graduates.
3. Survey for human factors which bring about honesty among government officials.
4. Study of motivations and values of government officials.
5. Surveys of situations where new procedures have been ~~and~~ are being tried out, e.g., situation in Dalat where the mail registry book is said no longer to be used.
- 5A. Development of a book of case studies of administrative improvement.
6. A comparative study of the working of the government's merit rating plan on which pay increases, effective 15 December, are said to be based.
7. Public relations projects.
8. Projects on the evaluation of various Department of Information campaigns and techniques.
9. Etc., etc.
