

Dear Liem:

Last week I wrote to ICA for confirmation on the per diem rate allowed participants in Puerto Rico. Their answer indicates that you will receive only \$8.00 a day per diem while you are in Puerto Rico as you will remain more than 21 days. Since I had already calculated the per diem for August 7th through 15th at \$12.00 a day, there will be a deduction for the overpayment of \$4.00 a day. In addition, I had to submit per diem figures for August 16th through the 31st and here again I used the \$12.00 a day figure. You should therefore be prepared for a deduction of \$100.00 on your September allowance. I am sorry for this error but I was unable to ascertain immediately what the correct rate was.

Please find enclosed the itinerary we discussed in Mr. Sheinbaum's office. I had hoped to check with Mr. Gilbert of Detroit and Mr. Evans of the State Police before sending this to you, but I suspect that both of these gentlemen are attending the same conference as you.
