Dear Miss Cunningham,

Thank you for the check for the period from August 1st through the 15. The amount of \$ 112.00 means a deduction of \$ 68 corresponding to 34 overpaid days at \$ 2.00 each.

In fact there were only 29 overpaid days ~~out~~ and the amount of deduction should be:

$$\$ 2.00 \times 29 = \$ 58.00 \text{ only}$$

When I was in Philadelphia, you sent me a check for the period from 16th April through 30 which amounted \$ 172.00 only; this meant a deduction from the \$ 12.00 rate to the \$ 10. rate for the last 4 days of this month because my sojourn to Washington D. C. began the 27th of April.

Since I left Washington D. C. for
N.Y City on the Sunday 30th of
May, the number of overpaid
days was really 29 days instead
of 34 as you have deducted.

You may have confirmation of
this fact by reviewing your ac-
counts for the month of April.

During our previous talk at
East-Lansing I was shown the ac-
count of the deduction and I
agreed willingly with you.

Never then, I presume you
could realize, dear Miss Cunningham
that I cannot be overdeducted
for the period I had got any
overpaid. i.e. 5 days.

So will you, please, give the
instructions in order to paid me back
\$10. overdeducted and add them
to my next check?
