Dear Erie,

I got your letter long time ago but I have been so busy lately that I could not keep up my correspondence? Thousand apologies.

First I have to tell you that I am staying in Saigon and am interested in a special library at the University of Saigon. This is a small library but does not have any librarian since two years ago.

Please don't be surprised or think that I have changed my mind as Mr. Watman often thought so about me.

I want to be useful to my country and since all libraries here belong to the government, it does not matter too much where I should work. Furthermore, the University library seems to have a very adequate staff (including Miss Nguyen in the near future), so I decided to work for this library in Saigon which needs a librarian badly. I am still waiting for the employment procedures to go through, for these usually take long time.

Now how have you been since you got the new apartment I bet you had good time with Vietnamese cooking and new participants. This reminds me of Mr. Thoi whom I saw one day getting off the car and entering the hotel with a majestic manner without looking at me. He seems to be very important and busy with his job. So I guess he has no

time to see his friends. Have you often heard from him?
