Dear Quynh:

Thank you for your letter concerning your program set up by Mr. McKay in Chicago. I was a little worried when I received the second letter from Mrs. Richards asking for additional information on what your particular interests were, but now that plans have been made for your stay in Chicago, I am sure that there will be no great difficulty in carrying out a program that is both interesting and instructive. On the other hand, I do not feel so optimistic about the replies that I have received concerning your visits to Washington and New York. I shall give some thought to the matter of additional contacts that we might utilize in either one of these cities.

I must caution you against using air mail envelopes and just putting four cent stamps rather than seven cent air mail stamps on them. This will delay mail to us by at least one or possibly two days as it must go through another office on campus for the collection of the additional three cents. Since you are going to be in Chicago for almost two more weeks, it is not so crucial this time, but in another case it might be very crucial and result in our not knowing where to reach you.
