Dear Dr. Austin

I think that you are very anxious to hear from me. But I would like to wait until everything is fairly settled before I write to you.

As you know I left Saigon on Sept 15 and after 2-day long trip I arrived in Bloomington at 6PM on Sept 17 as scheduled, just in time for the registration.

As soon as I arrived here, Miss Cunningham helped me in finding housing. Now I live at Hickory Hall, one of the halls in Graduate Residence Center. This dormitory is quite far from the places where my classes are taken. It takes me about 20-minutes to walk, and we live in this hall but eat in another hall which is far from my living place too. Therefore, I hope that I'll be able to move to another place which is nearer to my classes next semester.

I think that you are, now, anxious to know what courses I am taking this semester. Here they are:

- American Government
- World Politics
- Public Administration
- English composition, Advanced - Research papers -
- English literature
- a. g. Political Science is my major.

I discussed with Dr. Chapman, our adviser, about my entire program here. He anticipated that I'll be able to complete my B.S. in June 1962, without using any of my library service credits taken at Western Reserve University, Cleveland and at University of Wisconsin. After that, I'll be able go on working for my master degree in library sciences if opportunity permits.

But it's too early to discuss about this now.

I just received a check of \$180 from you through the kindness of Miss Cunningham and before I left Saigon I had received another check of \$100 from MSUG Saigon, that makes up \$280 = \$180 + \$100; but I don't know for how many days I'm supposed to receive that per diem, from what date to what date?

As Mr Aschom of MSUGS requested, I am sending herewith my travel itinerary, ticket coupons for both transportation and excess baggage.

Dear Dr. Austin, I'm sorry that I came here late so that I could not have time to stop at Michigan to meet you.

May I close here,
