As requested in your memo #414 dated January 21, 1960, we are forwarding CAT ticket #1293 38512 for return travel for Mr. La Van Hung from Lansing to Saigon.

Please note that the total charge for this ticket is \$950.95. Inasmuch as refund for his old ticket, in the amount of \$774.25, was received here in Saigon, we have paid that amount toward the total charge. This leaves a balance of \$176.70 due CAT, which, under the terms of the new contract, must be paid by U.S. dollars.

Therefore, you will also find enclosed Direct Payment Voucher for this \$176.70 due CAT.
