This application will not be acted upon unless the following papers are attached to it or received separately before the date for consideration:

1. Academic Records: These must be in the form of official transcripts or B. C. Form (originals, legal "true" copies, or notarized photostats). The records for an application as an undergraduate must show the complete secondary school studies, not just the last year, and any work completed in a college or university. An applicant to the Graduate School need send only the college or university records. In addition to the grades received in each subject each year, the number of weeks and the number of hours each week that each subject was studied must be shown, and also the applicant's relative standing in his class. The records must be in detail. For instance, the term, "mathematics" is not sufficient, but the transcript should show how much mathematics has been covered,—elementary, intermediate, and advanced algebra, plane and solid geometry, trigonometry, analytic geometry, integral and differential calculus—and similarly in other subjects. If possible, include as part of the academic record a syllabus or pages of a catalog describing each course.

2. Two letters of recommendation from people who are acquainted with your academic or professional experience sent separately or given to the applicant in sealed envelopes.

3. Two letters certifying ability in English, unless it is the applicant's mother tongue.

4. If the academic records are not in English a *certified English translation must be provided.*

5. Certification of undergraduate degrees and the class of the degrees in the case of graduate students.

Acceptance for admission academically does not mean that a scholarship has been awarded. These are two separate actions by different committees. If you have been accepted for admission you should not proceed to the United States on the assumption that you have also been given a scholarship. For the latter you must have a definite notification of scholarship award. There is no special fellowship or scholarship application form for foreign students.

24. This question concerning living accommodations is for graduate and undergraduate students. When accommodations are reserved the student is committed for the full academic year. Those who request a reservation will be assigned accommodations if they have been accepted for admission by July 1. Those accepted after that date will be put on the waiting list for possible cancellations.
