

Because of last year, I was uncertain about the possibilities of my remaining in the States for further work, some of my courses taken, could not be counted towards a Ph.D. in Economics; it means that I loose about 11 semester-credits hours that I have to make up in order to be able to get the permission for taking the Prelim. The result is that this semester I have registered in 5 courses, presumably you knew the tuitions bill that Vanderbilt had sent to you. The work has kept me really very busy and although I have been taking one course with Mr. Cole in International Economics, it does not mean that I can afford some relaxation! Sometimes, I do not feel or remember that I have any Sunday since the term began! I do not know why I have involved myself in this Ph.D. business, since the marginal utility of a M.A. is still high in underdeveloped countries!!!! I hope you won't hear the same thing from Than and Toan..

I have bought a number of books and I would like to ask you whether you are in a position to make some advance out of my books allowance and towards the end of the semester I will submit to you the lists of books with their invoices duly signed by Mr. Cole, or I shall send the invoice to you after each buying of books.

If among the Vietnamese Participants now at East Lansing there is a man whose name is Tong Huu Quang from the Police Department I should be grateful to you to remind me to him. He was one of my classmate at high school.

In any case it was a very successful reception with fried rice as the piece de resistance and fried bread topped by a combination of shrimp, pork, crab, mushroom and onion mixed together with flour and eggs. Trust that this arrives just after you have had a really good dinner so that I don't succeed in making you too hungry.

I was most pleased with your letter and amused about the marginal utility of Ph.D. work - considering the fact that this was exactly the econ theory course that made me decide it would be much easier to rewrite an old thesis (still undone) and resurrect some old credits rather than starting afresh I really sympathize with you.
