Dear Miss Cunningham,

Many sincere thanks for the telephone call the other day. Still I do not know what to do these days whether to leave Nashville or not. I would like to let you know that - as "a good and obedient government employee" - I have already written to MR. Vũ quốc Thông to comply with his official request that Vietnamese participants under the INA's auspices should report monthly to the INA. I am sure that a more realistic explanation would be able to alter the INA's request - instead of a monthly report, it would be more sensible to send a semester report - and I believe that a petition signed by all participants with favorable suggestions from the office of the Coordinator of the Vietnam Project ~~office~~ would be successful.

There was ^{another} Vietnamese student at Vanderbilt last year. He finished his M.A. in Economics and has returned back to Saigon working now in the Ministry of National Economy. His name is NGUYỄN HOÀNG CƯỜNG. I am inclined to suggest

that the person who is contemplating to go to Vanderbilt this fall should get in touch with Mr. CUBONG and in so doing he will certainly have ~~a~~ first hand information about the Vanderbilt Programme. For the time being, I cannot say much and enter into specific details; but grosso modo, a would-be Vietnamese participant at Vanderbilt should ~~have~~ have owing to his foreign background and the more or less specialised programme of studies offered at Vanderbilt - two basic working tools: (1) a good command of English (2) and a good grasp of basic intermediate economics. Then with average power of assimilation and a systematic and serious approach to the work required, he will certainly get through. I should add that he does not have to worry much before coming to Vanderbilt and that he will have a really unusual opportunity to learn and that he will surely benefit a great deal from his stay at Vanderbilt. Details relating to the choice of courses, the number of papers that have to be written are of secondary importance and can be discussed only on spot with his adviser. I want to stress again that he should be prepared to work systematically and pretty hard; then everything will be all right.

I understand that Dr. D.C. Cole will be back to Vanderbilt sometime at the end of this month. I will have then the opportunity to discuss my "Summer plan" with him. Perhaps, he will be

able to help me solve some academic bottlenecks. (3)
What I prefer to ~~have~~ do is to have my oral
exam 14th Sept. and leave Nashville 15th Sept.
I do not want to have a vacation first and
then come back to Nashville and enter into
the "slaughter house"!!

wishes for more glamorous success during this
