Please find enclosed your per diem check for the period from December 1-15 which also includes the additional \$4. for the period from November 13-15. However, I shall have to deduct the additional payment made in your last check (November 15-30) for your trip to Atlanta from November 20-22 which you will not make from your next per diem.

I doubt that the additional per diem will anywhere near cover the expenses incurred on your trip to East Lansing.

My new car arrived on Tuesday noon after everyone but I had given up hope. They were all advising me to call the Company, perhaps even the police - but my faith was justified when Thu arrived - it seems that he had to lay over an extra day in order to secure the 300 mile check. 
Dear Miss Cunningham,


