Mr. Ramos' (PIO/P 92-79-079-1-80256) training objectives, as set forth by the USOM, are:

- 1) To observe the program planning and coordinating operations of technical assistance in ICA/Washington
- 2) To observe similar activities and operations of the United Nations Technical Assistance Board in New York
- 3) To observe similar activities and procedures in U.S. Departments concerned with technical assistance programs
- 4) To make observations in Universities which have made Studies in technical assistance and in other agencies which are concerned with implementing technical assistance
- 5) To observe the coordination of technical assistance programs in Puerto Rico where conditions are similar to those in the Philippines
- 6) To observe the actual operations in ICA/Washington and other agencies in implementing the participant training program

With regard to training, Mr. Ramos is the point of coordination for all Filipinos receiving training abroad and for all Southeast Asia nationals receiving training in the Philippines. Looking toward an expansion of training in the Philippines, Mr. Ramos is interested in the organization of our training offices, relationships with participating agencies, type and scope of training available, implementation of training programs and evaluation techniques.

With regard to program planning and coordination of technical assistance in ICA/W, Mr. Ramos wishes to acquire a background in our procedures as well as the considerations which enter into program content in the various categories of technical assistance. This knowledge will be used to facilitate the coordination of ICA project proposals and third-country project proposals to be implemented by the Philippine Government.
