Mr. Rawiwatanawongs, age 49, is Chief of the Division of Occupational Assistance in the Department of Public Welfare. It is likely that on his return he will take on a planning position in the evolving community development program in Thailand. He will be involved in planning for economic development and social betterment in the large scale Self-Help Land Settlement Project in the Department of Public Welfare or in the emerging Community Development Program. In his present position his responsibilities include the development and homesteading of land reservation areas.

During the three months that Mr. Rawiwatanawongs has been in the United States he has had an opportunity to meet agricultural and community leaders and see the work of the Penland School of Handicrafts in North Carolina and its efforts in the promotion of home handicrafts, to attend the University of Chicago for one quarter with course work directed by Dr. Philip Hauser with emphasis on social and economic surveys course and a course in decision making--group process and planning and to participate and observe at an area conference of community leaders at Southern Illinois University.

His training program should stress planning for rural welfare. He should not only study the theory of planning, but he should also consult with officials and observe operating programs in those agencies concerned with land settlement, rural credit, agricultural development, health water supply, sanitation, housing and community organizations. He should become familiar with selected community actions and programs in various parts of the U.S.

Mr. Rawiwatanawongs attended Assumption College and studied law at Thammasat University.

Community Development Planning & Operations

The Government of Thailand is undertaking a plan to decentralize administration and strengthen its services at the village level. Also, it is planning a national community development program which will be integrated with the Thailand-UNESCO Fundamental Education Center (TUFEC).

Except for the training staff at TUFEC, few, if any, persons in Thailand have had any training in the principles and practices of community development. No Thai official has had experience in the planning, administration and field operations involved in a community development program. This project is to provide the training needed.

Mr. Prajuab Rawiwatanawongs holds the position as Chief of the Division of Occupational Assistance in the Department of Public Welfare. It is probable that he will be assigned to a responsible position in the field of planning in the evolving community development program.

His training program, should stress planning for rural welfare. He should not only study the theory of planning, but he should also consult with officials and observe operating programs in those national or departmental agencies concerned with land settlement, the Tennessee Valley Authority, rural credit, agricultural development, health water supply, sanitation, housing and community organizations. He should become familiar with selected community actions and programs in various parts of the U.S. He should gain an appreciation of the value of social and economic surveys as a prerequisite to planning.

The participant should spend five or six weeks in Puerto Rico to observe the land settlement work of the Social Programs Administration and the Community Education Program in the Department of Education. He should observe the organization, operations and training aspects involved in each program, and especially the role of village organizations.

Mr. Prajuab will be involved in planning for economic development and social betterment either in the large-scale Self-Help Land Settlement Project in the Department of Public Welfare or in the emerging Community Development Program. Since one of the proposed training centers for multi-purpose village level workers will be located at the Saraburi Self-Help Land Settlement Project, a joint planning effort will be necessary in which the participant can play an important role. Also, he can share his training and experience with other staff members in the Department of Public Welfare.
