## PERIODIC REPORT

Period: from 1-19<sup>th</sup> 1959 to 3-20<sup>th</sup> 1959.

After 9 weeks in Direct Current Laboratory, from 1-17<sup>th</sup> 1959 to 1-18<sup>th</sup> 1959, then I was introduced in Alternating current Laboratory for 3 weeks from 1-19<sup>th</sup> 1959 to 2-6<sup>th</sup> 1959, in order to get some basis in Alternating current and to learn how to operate in some testing equipment. The only equipment, that I have studied is the OSCILLOSCOPE, I known the general uses of the OSCILLOSCOPE by reading in the book and by looking some student working in it. The Instructor in this laboratory didn't give me any help, and then my situation was alike in Direct current Laboratory, I finished this laboratory on 2-6<sup>th</sup> 1959.

I was introduced in Receiver Laboratory on 2-9<sup>th</sup> 1959 and according to M<sup>r</sup>.
